Hello Friends,

What an honor it is to be asked to share with you about the recent immersion class I completed. As some of you may be aware, I am in seminary pursuing a Master of Arts in Practical Theology, as well as working towards candidacy to become a Deacon. Returning to the role of a student after thirty years was not necessarily my plan, but as we all know God has plans for me and for each of us. As this week's sermon title is "A Methodist Loves Others", I was asked to share my experience from my class: Being with the Poor, held at the United Methodist Church for All People and Community Development for All People in Southside Columbus.

Immersion is exactly what took place. I was able to be in the community with folks on the margins. Folks that I do not normally encounter in Mentor, Ohio. I was able to work alongside people in the Free Store, an amazing place that started the All People community and offers free clothes and housewares, and in the Fresh Market, where people can have free produce five days a week. I worked with the leaders for the afterschool program at one of the elementary schools in the neighborhood. I shared meals and worship with this community as well as spent time learning more about poverty and how various income levels are affecting Southside.

The most important concept that I must share with you all is this...being with poor is not about doing for others; it is not about trying to fix the situation or people. The most important thing that we are called to do is to be in a relationship WITH the poor and marginalized. While it is easier to be transactional, God wants us to be relational. We are created to be in a relationship with God and with people. God wants us to love one another, to be in a relationship with one another. As we process the message this week, my challenge for each of us is to be relational and not transactional, and my prayer is that we all remember that a Methodist LOVES OTHERS.
