Highlights History: Henry Van Dyke wrote this hymn in 1907. A well-loved hymn, Van Dyke later stated that, "These verses are simple expressions of common Christian feelings and desires for this present time—hymns of today that may be sung together by people who know the thought of the age, and are not afraid that any truth of science will destroy religion, or any revolution on earth overthrow the kingdom of heaven." As a son of a clergyman, professor at Princeton, and contemporary of President Woodrow Wilson, Helen Keller, and Mark Twain, he made a lasting literary and spiritual impact that we experience even today. The hymn we highlight this week, as Van Dyke himself felt, is "a hymn of trust and joy and hope."
