"The Easter Story"

"The story of Easter is the story of God's wonderful window of divine surprise."

Mystery novels are a popular genre of fiction in which a detective, either an amateur or a professional, solves a crime or a series of crimes. Suspense is the driving force as the plot unfolds with a surprise ending. One might pick up a mystery novel and struggle to put it down, reading page by page at the edge of your seat. Mystery novels and their element of suspense engage readers to read a story from cover to cover, to become involved with the unfolding plot from beginning to end.

Two thousand years ago a mystery began to unfold as a Galilean itinerant preacher rode into the capital city of Jerusalem. During the next few days the plot builds, culminating seven days later with the surprise ending.

A study by Nicholas Christenfeld and Jonathan Leavitt of the University of California San Diego's psychology department studied subjects reading short stories and found that those who read the ending first actually had more fun.

Perhaps you're one of those people who like to read the end of the book first?

The psychologists suggest that the reason spoilers have more fun is because it's easier to read a spoiled story. They surmise that once you know the ending it is easier to process the information and focus on a deeper understanding of the information.

The Galilean story's surprise comes with the empty tomb of Easter. In this story we know the ending, so we can freely focus on the details of the story. The pages of the drama played out over the last week of Jesus' life and are known as holy week; Palm Sunday through Easter. It begins on the back of a colt and ends in a cemetery. Who would have ever guessed the ending?

We invite you to be a spoiler reader. Sure we know the end, so let's try to process the rest of the drama as we walk through Holy Week together.

April 13 Palm Sunday with services at 9 & 11 a.m.

April 17 7:30 p.m. Holy Thursday service with Holy Communion

April 18 7:30 p.m. Good Friday service

April 20 Easter services at 7:00; 9:00; 11:00 a.m.

Together let's discover the week of drama and help make the final page most meaningful.

### KEEP STUFFING YOUR SOCK TO STOP HUNGER NOW

Approximately 25,000 people die each day from hunger or hunger-related causes. 74% of them are children. We can do something about that. Each year Americans spend about \$23.8 billion on candy, \$65.9 billion on soft drinks, and \$566 billion eating out in restaurants. Why not give up a candy bar, soft drink or meal out and donate the money to Mentor UMC's Stop Hunger Now effort?

Mentor UMC is raising \$8000 to host an event on Saturday, May 17 to pack 30,000 highly nutritious dehydrated meals comprised or rice, soy, vegetables, flavoring and 21 essential vitamins and minerals. The meals are easily transported to crisis-burdened areas or supplied to school feeding programs around the world. More than 270 socks have been distributed throughout the congregation to set aside money during Lent.

### THROUGH THE YEARS

The Easter season has many traditions. One of the most varied and universal is the food made for Easter and the Easter season. While we have our Easter food staples in the United States, there are many others around the world. Some of them are:

- Tsoureki—a brioch like bread from Greece. It is flavored with the essence of the seeds of wild cherries. Hard boiled eggs are placed on top. The eggs are dyed red to symbolize the blood of Christ.
- Columba Di Paqua a candied peel stuffed cake from Italy. It is often made in the shape of a dove symbolizing peace.
- Capirotada—a spiced bread pudding from Mexico. It is made with raisins, cloves, cinnamon sticks, and Cheese. The cloves represent the nails of the Cross. The cinnamon sticks represent the Cross. The bread represents the body of Christ.
- Kulich—a cake made in Eastern Orthodox countries like Bulgaria, Georgia, and Russia. It is made in a Tall decanter and covered in white icing with either sprinkles or flowers. The cake is often blessed By the priest after Easter service.

Pacoca De Amendolm—an Easter treat from Brazil. It is made from peanuts, sugar, and cassava flour.

Finally, in a lighter and non-religious note, there is the Easter Bilby in Australia. A Bilby is an indigenous rodent in Australia with long ears. He is used in place of a rabbit since rabbits are notorious pests to crops. The Bilby brings the chocolate eggs. You can also enjoy an Easter Bilby!

Whatever food you may enjoy at this time of year, the important thing to remember is Christ's resurrection and triumph over death. Happy Easter!
