From the Pastor

"Expanding our borders"

In the year 1818, James Monroe served as the 5th U.S. President. The first steam vessel to traverse the Great Lakes was launched. The 49th parallel formed the border between the United States and Canada. The Mentor United Methodist Church was formed. A 9 year-old Felix Mendelssohn performed his first public concert. "Silent Night, Holy Night" was written. Handel's Messiah premiered for the first time in America.

Did you catch that Mentor UMC was formed in the midst of national and world history? We don't even know the exact day, but sometime in the year 1818 the church was chartered. The exact date was not important; the event was hardly noticed as eight charter members just agreed to be a church.

I was reading a piece of Mentor history and another event happened in 1818. It read like this, "Mentor Township loses its southern boundary to newly established Kirtland Township." I thought there was a bit of irony in that statement. Here's what I see, in the year Mentor Township lost is boundary, another boundary expanded. Let me explain...

For the 200 years since 1818, the Mentor UMC has pushed its boundaries. This congregation is marked by faith-based risk taking and disciple-challenging surrender to the work of God. Just think, what started as four couples/eight individuals grew to over 1,700 members. Eight individuals and one pastor grew to a 600 weekly worshipers. This congregation has brought people in, brought them up in faith, and sent them out into the world. This congregation has sent several into a vocation of ministry, and many more to short-term volunteers in missions. Mentor UMC has expanded its borders from Mentor Township to the entire region. And the borders have pushed out from the region to touch and serve lives from Maine to New Mexico to Florida; and beyond to Puerto Rico, West Africa, and elsewhere. The borders of the church have moved out and impacted the world for Jesus Christ.

A few years ago there was quite a stir over the book entitled, The Prayer of Jabez. It was based on the following verse: "Jabez cried out to the God of Israel. He said, 'I wish you would bless me. I wish you would give me more territory. Let your power protect me. Keep me from harm. Then I won't have any pain.' God gave him what he asked for." (I Chronicles 4:10) Many felt that the message of the book could lead to some false assumptions and perhaps dangerous expectations based on self-centered ambition. I look at this congregation as having lived into the heart of that verse with a desire to be used of God in selfless and serving ways. It has resulted in expanding borders.

Throughout 2018, we will take moments to celebrate and share our history. But when I go back 200 years to a house church of four couples, I have to wonder, what was their vision for the next 200 years? Did they see their borders expand? That we don't know, but we do know that they stepped out in faith. That's our calling as we stand on their shoulders. As we walk in faithfulness, God can use us in ways we would never imagine.

News from Commission on Missions

The new year is upon us and Missions Commission has some new and exciting ideas for ways that we can serve and share the love of Christ in our community and to those in need. We also have some on-going commitments where we need your help.

• MUMC has committed with Lake Geauga Habitat for Humanity to be one of 12 local churches participating in an Apostle Build project. We will be providing funds and volunteer manpower to build a home in Painesville during 2018. The land has been purchased and the deserving family, a single mom with a six-year-old child, selected. We will be bringing you updates once the ground is broken.

• We have committed to assist the Painesville Hispanic Alliance Church provide classes in English as a Second Language. Classes started this past fall at the YMCA and are averaging twenty people a week. The plan is to expand the program, meeting twice a week in a larger space, which will allow the group to incorporate Bible study and children's programs.

• Project Hope is a very busy shelter for the homeless, the only one in Lake County. MUMC provides a dinner only once a month on the first Wednesday of every month for 50 individuals at the shelter. It is one small way that we can be Christ's hands, providing a meal to those less fortunate than we are. Please do not be overwhelmed by the number 50. You do not need to provide the whole meal. Perhaps you would like to donate a salad, or a casserole or a meatloaf, or a dessert. Maybe you just want to help cook a meal with food that others have purchased. If you are not a cook, you could pay for a catered meal, or deliver the meal. We do not serve the meal, but we deliver it to the shelter in Painesville by 6:45 PM ready to be served. • More Than A Meal is another on-going opportunity to put your faith into action. Journey groups, committees, and families can sponsor a meal on the last Saturday of every month. Through The Years - Introduction to the Bicentennial

The year 2018 marks the 200th anniversary of Mentor United Methodist Church. From its beginning in 1818 with four couples meeting in their homes with the Rev. Ira Eddy, Mentor Methodist has grown into the church we know today. We are one of the largest congregations in the East Ohio Conference.

Originally called the Mentor Methodist Episcopal Church, the church has also been known as the Mentor Methodist Church and, since 1968, the Mentor United Methodist Church. These name changes reflect the changes the church structure has had. The church has belonged to many difference conferences within the Methodist structure. It has seen the population movement west throughout the state of Ohio. The church has also had difference buildings and additions to those structures. The church has gone from covered barns for horses to large parking lots for cars. It has seen women become pastors and contemporary worship services started. It once even had a former US President (Theodore Roosevelt) attend one of its services. It has been blessed to be served by outstanding ministers, musicians, staff and by many wonderful members in its congregation.

To put the year 1818 into a historical time-frame, consider these events which occurred that year. Paul Revere died, Mary Todd Lincoln was born, Illinois became the 21st state admitted to the US, and the White House reopened after being burned by the British in the War of 1812. The Rush-Bagot Treaty limited naval vessels on the Great Lakes and establish the 49th parallel as the border between the US and Canada from western Minnesota to the Pacific Ocean.

This year, the church plans to observe this important milestone in many ways. From a reunion dinner to a special music service, many people will contribute their talents to celebrate MUMC's 200 years. One time capsule will be opened and another will be created. There will be more information on commemorations as the year continues. We also want to look toward the future and envision the MUMC to come.

Through The Years - 1818

We will be recalling some Mentor United Methodist history in this column during the year 2018, the church's bicentennial. The year 1818 saw the establishment of a congregation in the community of Mentor, Ohio. A circuit rider of the Methodist Episcopal Church, as our denomination was called then, the Reverend Ira Eddy was appointed by the Ohio Conference to the Grand River Circuit. One of the locations where he stopped to organize a Methodist Society was Mentor, Ohio. Here he formed a congregation consisting of four couples. They were: Mr. and Mrs. Nowland, Mr. and Mrs. Brass, Mr. and Mrs. Wilson and Mr. and Mrs. Jewet. They met in the homes of the couples. Rev. Eddy would instruct them on how to conduct worship while he was traveling to other locations in his circuit.

Rev. Ira Eddy was born on March 31, 1796, in Sherborne Center, Vermont. He made a personal conversion to God in 1813 in New York State. He began his Methodist preaching career on trial status. He was ordained a Deacon in 1819 and an Elder in 1821. Rev. Eddy finished his circuit rider duties in Mentor in 1819, he returned to Mentor Methodist Episcopal Church as a pastor in 1846 and served for one year. He married Nancy Brigden in 1819 and they had nine children. Nancy died in 1862. Rev. Eddy married his second wife, Sarah Sanderson, in 1863. They had no children. Sarah died in 1866. Rev. Eddy died on November 1, 1874, in Cortland, Ohio. He is buried in Edinburg Cemetery in Edinburg (Portage County), Ohio.

The religious zeal of the early circuit riders was matched by their physical strength and courage. They had to endure many hardships while riding from congregation to congregation. They did not always know where their lodging would be or where their food would come from. The circuits were mainly wilderness and the forests were populated with wolves and bears. They had to maintain their horses, as well. Indeed the First Discipline of the Methodist Episcopal Church instructs traveling ministers to "be merciful to your beast. Not only ride moderately, but see with your own eyes that your horse is rubbed and fed". You had to take good care of your transportation!
