I once heard a person share that what defines a church more than anything else is its music. There is no question that musical style is important to our worship. "Addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart..." (Ephesians 5:19)

Music helps us express our feelings and thoughts toward God; music helps us grasp the wonders of God's love and grace. Music ministers to the soul and expresses our love and awe of God.



Through The Years

While we are celebrating our church's bicentennial with a wonderful concert and some historical information on our church organ, I thought it would be a good time to briefly mention the history of music in the Christian church. While this is an enormous subject that would take articles like this for years and years to cover, there are a few interesting points to mention about music and church worship.

Early Christians continued the practice of Jewish worshipers by singing songs. Indeed, music has a way of allowing people to express thoughts and emotions that the spoken words cannot. Psalm 150 states to praise God with trumpets, lutes, harps, tambourines, strings, pipes, and cymbals.

However, for the first few centuries of the Christian era, singing in the church was done without instruments. It was believed this was a "purer" way to worship God. Hymns, psalmodies, and spirituals were sung. Eventually, parts of the Mass were put to music such as the Benedictus and the Gloria. Gregorian Chant became standardized around 600 A. D.

The big breakthrough in Christian music came with the introduction of the organ. While invented in the third century B. C., it did not make it's way to western Europe until the eighth century. In 755 A.D., one was given to Pepin the Short, King of the Franks (father of Charlemagne) by the Byzantine Emperor Constantius. By the year 1000 A.D., organ music was an integral part of Christian worship.

John Wesley, while not a fan of instruments in church services, was an enthusiastic supporter of singing during Methodist services. This contrasted with the Anglican church at the time where singing was not emphasized. Indeed a writer in 1787 stated that for every one person drawn to Methodism by preaching, ten came as a result of the music!

Church music has also represented the aspirations of Christians. The African-American community has left a rich literature of church music hoping for their liberation through Christ.

Today, many services use contemporary songs with contemporary instruments. This is just the latest example of music evolving to meet the worship needs of the followers of Jesus Christ. May that praise always continue in music. Hallelujah!
