From the Pastor

Matthew 25 records these words of Jesus...

35 "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, 36 I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'

37 "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? 38 When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? 39 When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?"

40 "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

World hunger is a reality, and Jesus taught us to feed the hungry. That's what we're going to do on May 19 as we seek to change the world. But first, look at these facts:

- According to the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations, 815 million people in the world don't get the food they need to live a healthy life. That translates to about 11.3% of the world's population.
- According to the World Food Programme, 66 million primary school-age children attend classes hungry across the developing world.
- FAO projects that across Asia, two-thirds of the population is affected by
- hunger issues. Hunger is also very real in sub-Saharan Africa. In 2010, an estimated 7.6 million children more than 20,000 a day died. Poor nutrition played a role in at least half of these deaths.
- The world produces enough food to feed all 7.5 billion people, but transportation prevents the distribution.

More facts:

Mentor United Methodist Church is doing something about it on May 19 as we partner with Rise Against Hunger to package 20,000 Meals!

What it will take:

- Friday Setup at 7:00 PM with 8 10 able-bodied volunteers
 - Saturday food packaging with 2 shifts of 50-60 people each • First shift will be from 8:00 - 10:00 AM
 - The second shift from 10:30 AM 12:30 PM.
- \$5,925.52 to purchase food items and pay for shipping (less than \$0.30 a meal)

We have taken a step of faith that we can do it! The contract has been signed. This is a great opportunity to live Jesus' command to feed the hungry. It is a great opportunity to serve together as a family or individuals. Watch for details for both financial support and signing up as we join together to Rise Against Hunger.

News from Commission on Missions Change the World Day

Saturday May 19th, 2018

Change the world day has become a strong tradition here at Mentor UMC. This year we are going to participate in a world changing activity that we helped with a few years ago. We will be packaging meals with Rise Against Hunger.



Changing the world takes planning. We are planning to pack over 20,000 meals on Saturday, May 19 in 2 sessions. The first session will be 8-10 AM and the second from 10:30-12:30 PM. There are openings for 50-60 people in each session. We will also need some help setting up and preparing on Friday the 18 from 7 PM -9 PM.

Changing the world is fun. Sign up will be online or at the sign up table in April and May. Sign up with your family or friends and make it a fun time.

Changing the world takes resources. There are opportunities for everyone to be involved in this mission. In order to purchase the supplies for the meal and to distribute them, we will need to raise \$5,925 for this event. The cost is \$.29 per meal. Maybe you and your family decide to set aside a specific amount per meal or per day and donate those funds toward the Change the World mission this year.

Changing the world is possible. Rise Against Hunger is a ministry that has a vision to relieve world hunger by 2030. That means 815 million people currently facing hunger will be reduced to 0 in 12 years. Check out http:// www.riseagainsthunger.org/ to learn more about the mission.

Through The Years -

The hymn "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty" (No. 64 in our hymnal) was written by Reginald Heber and John B. Dykes. Rev. Heber, a bishop in the Church of England wrote the lyrics to over fifty hymns. He was born in Hodnet, England in 1783 and died in 1826. He was educated in Oxford and served parishes in England. Rev. Heber was very interested in mission work and became, in 1823, the Bishop of Calcutta, India. He worked very hard to open church positions to native Indians and was instrumental in getting the first Indian ordained as a Deacon of the Church of England. Sadly, Rev. Heber died after serving only three years in India. He worked buried there near the altar of his church. A memorial to him sits in St. Paul's Cathedral in London. He wrote the lyrics of "Holy, Holy, Holy!" for Trinity Sunday. This is the Sunday after Pentecost and celebrates the Holy Trinity.

John B. Dykes was born in Hull, England in 1823. He was a church organist at the age of ten and studied at Cambridge. He wrote over 300 hymn tunes. One of these is the tune "Nicaea" written in 1861. He put the lyrics of Rev. Heber to the tune to create "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty" The name of the tune Nicaea, refers to the Council of Nicaea which in 325 A. D. established the belief in the Holy Trinity or triune God. It declared that God is three persons; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This was a watershed moment in church history as the council rejected the idea put forth by Arius (a Christian priest from Alexandria, Egypt) that Christ was not fully divine. This year Trinity Sunday is May 27.

When you look at our hymnal, you will see the names of Reginald Heber and John B. Dykes. Also, to the right is the word Nicaea which refers to the original tune the hymn is based upon. The hymn has been recorded many times by artists from Bing Crosby to Amy Grant. It has even been used as music in some movies such as the 1953 version of "Titanic" and the 1956 film "Fastest Gun Alive".


