From the Pastor

"Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of (people). At once they left their nets and followed him." Matthew 4:19 & 20

One study showed that 60% of us make a resolution – but within 30 days 25% have failed to follow through; by year's end, there is an 80% fail rate. Steepletalk January

Through The Years



The old Mentor Methodist sanctuary, dedicated in 1906, featured several stained glass windows. These were gifts to the church from individuals or organizations. When the old sanctuary was razed in 1987 to make way for the Chapel, these wonderful works of art were preserved. Today, most of them can still be seen around our church. I will discuss a few of them this month.

First, and most prominent, is the glass dome in the Chapel. This dome served the same purpose in the 1906 sanctuary and was a gift from the Epworth League. The Epworth League was an organization for Methodist young people. The Epworth League came about as a consolidation of other young people's groups and was founded in Cleveland in 1889. The Epworth League consisted of senior and junior branches. The Epworth League remained in existence until 1939 when the Methodist Episcopal Church, the Methodist Episcopal Church, South and the Methodist Protestant Church merged to form the Methodist Church. That merger spelled the end of the Epworth League. The new, merged church called their young peoples group the Methodist Youth Fellowship.

The Epworth League also donated a stained glass window which today sits in the Adams Parlor. It identifies itself as Chapter 8308.

The Arcade contains two stained glass windows from the old sanctuary. The first is dedicated to Martin Sawyer from Mr. and Mrs. Orlando Sawyer. Martin was a long time trustee of the church. Next to the Sawyer window is one donated by Mr. and Mrs. Edmund Cadle in memory of their daughter, Margaret Emily Cadle who passed away in 1902 at the age of thirteen.

All three of these stained glass windows, the Epworth League, Sawyer, and Cadle had been in the choir loft of the 1906 sanctuary. It is truly a blessing to have these windows still with us. We owe the church members involved in the planning for the 1988 renovation a debt of gratitude for having the foresight to preserve them.

There are other windows and decorations around the church that need to be mentioned. They will be discussed in next month's article.

We made it through 2019! Remember how twenty years ago everyone was worried about Y2K? Can you even believe that WAS twenty years ago? So crazy how time keeps marching on... Did you make any resolutions?

If reading more is one of your resolutions, the next Book Club Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 14 from 6:00 to 8:00 PM. The book is <u>Queen Bees & Wanna Bees</u> by Rosalind Wiseman. I am excited to share in meaningful discussion after reading this book. Our kids are inundated with so many different things. I really believe there is a lot to share from this resource.

I was able to participate in Dale Hudson's workshop "10 Keys to Seeing Kids Follow Jesus for a Lifetime" while at the ETCH Conference in September. Hudson used the Parable of the Sower from Matthew 13 to illustrate that the soil is what makes the difference. One of the important things that we need to remember is "Today's kids are not yesterday's kids." Here is Hudson's list:

- Know Jesus instead of just knowing about Jesus.
- 2. Teach the next generation to keep their eyes focused on the perfect person and the perfect purpose.
- 3. Teach them why we believe what we believe.
- 4. Ask the hard auestions now.
- 5. Connect them with Godly adults.
- 6. Help them understand Jesus doesn't just want to be a part of their life. He wants to be the center of their life.
- 7. Make church a priority.
- 8. Teach them to read and apply God's Word. Help them memorize and understand God's Word.
- 9. Help them develop spiritual gifts.
- Help them understand it's about serving more than being served.

This is a great list to keep in mind as you disciple your family in 2020. No matter if you are a regular attender or attend worship as it fits, Jesus wants to meet you where you are! It is never too late to start any of the things on this list. If your kids question you, you can just say that you are trying something new. You are the parent and can do just that.

As you start filling in your 2020 calendar, write in church on Sunday mornings, Youth 56 on the second and fourth Sunday evenings, and any of the other things that we are doing, be it a study or a family fun time. I want to encourage and support you as you lead your family onto a path of Christ-centered discipleship. God has big plans for each and every one of us. Let's help Him make those plans a reality this year!
