The hymn is based on part of Luke 24:29 Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over (NRSV.) The request is for the Lord to remain with us through the trials of life and even death. The hymn is often sung at funerals and commemorations. It was performed at the funeral of George V of Great Britain (1936). It was also performed at the opening of the 2012 Summer Olympics in London. Since 1927, it has been played before the English Football Association (FA) Cup Final.
