Hymn History: The words to this hymn are from a poem written by Arabella Katherine Hankey.
She was born in London in 1834. Though a devout Anglican, she was inspired by the
Methodist revival of John Wesley. She developed a serious illness in 1866 and was bedridden
for a long period. While recovering, she wrote the poem, Tell Me the Old Old Story of Unseen
Things Above. She recovered from her illness and lived to age 77, dying in 1911. The music
was written by William G Fischer. He was born in 1835 in Baltimore to German immigrants. He
learned to read music singing at church. Relocating to Philadelphia, he learned bookbinding.
He studied piano and organ in the evenings. Fischer was well known as a conductor of large
choirs, leading groups of up to a thousand at revival meetings. He also ran a successful
piano business and taught music at a boarding school in Philadelphia. Fischer died there in
1912.
