Hymn History: The music to this hymn is a medieval French melody. This melody is based on a Latin song entitled "Orientis Partibus," which means *From the East*. It is attributed to Pierre de Corbeil (1150-1222) and is one of the oldest songs used for a Christmas Carol. The English words were written by Robert Davis (1881-1950) around 1920. The words describe the gifts presented to baby Jesus by the donkey, cow, sheep, and dove in the stable and the comfort they gave the Child. The hymn reminds us that it wasn't just the shepherds and Wise Men who witnessed His Birth, but also some of God's other creatures. The words written by Davis utilize an old folk song structure with the last line of each stanza repeating the first line of the stanza. This technique allowed people to join in singing even with no printed music. This hymn has been recorded by many famous artists, including Burl Ives, Harry Belafonte, Johnny Cash, and Garth Brooks among others.
