"Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" **HYMN OF MISSION** Hymn History: The words to this hymn are from the original Charles Wesley hymn of 1747. The version we sing today is based on the music of John Zundel who wrote the hymn Beecher and used Wesley's words for the hymn. John Zundel was an accomplished composer, arranger, organist and teacher. He was born in Germany in 1815. Besides playing the organ, Zundel studied organ building with Eberhard Friedrich Walcker. Zundel performed the first organ concert on Russian soil in St. Petersburg in 1840. He emigrated to the U. S in 1847 and eventually became the church organist at the Plymouth Church in Brooklyn, New York. The pastor there was the famous preacher Henry Ward Beecher. Zundel's hymn is named for him. Zundel moved back to Germany in 1878 and died there in 1882.




























