"Jesus, United By Thy Grace" *HYMN OF MISSION Hymn History: The music to this hymn was written by John B. Dykes. He was born in Kingston upon Hull (usually referred to as Hull), England in 1823. His grandfather, Rev. Thomas Dykes had built and was the Vicar at St John's Church in Hull. John began playing the organ at that church at age ten. Dykes also played the piano and violin. He went to Cambridge University and earned three degrees including a Doctorate of Music. Dykes was ordained a Deacon in the Church of England at York Minster in 1848. He was named a Canon at Durham Cathedral and later became the Pastor at St. Oswald's Church in Durham, a position he held until his death. Rev. Dykes wrote over 300 hymns including several that are in our hymnal. Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God Almighty (Number 64) is one of his best known. Rev. Dykes died in 1876 in Ticéhurst, England.


