He emigrated to the United States in 1884 with his wife, Eliza. He eventually settled in New York City. Rev. Blandly joined the Salvation Army in 1890. While little is known about his life, it is known that he turned down the ministry of an established affluent church to serve in Hell's Kitchen, the notorious Manhattan neighborhood of gangs and poor people. When asked by friends why he chose this assignment, he quoted Mark 8:34where Jesus says "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." Rev. Blandly died in Waverly, New York in 1915.
