*HYMN OF CENTERING "Tell Me the Stories of Jesus" UMH 277 Hymn History: The words to his hymn were written by William H. Parker. He was born in Basford, Nottingham, England in 1845. Parker was an apprentice machine-constructor for a lace making factory. He later joined an insurance company and became its head. Parker was a devoted member of the Chelsea Street Baptist Church in Nottingham. He taught Sunday School. Parker would write hymns in observance of Sunday School special occasions. The hymn we sing today was inspired by the students requesting "Teacher, tell us another story." The words reflect the passages in Matthew 19:14, Mark 10:14, and Luke 18:16–17 where Jesus met and welcomed the children. Frederick Challinor took Parker's hymn and set it to new music as an entry to a musical competition. William H. Parker died in Basford in 1929.
