"Hymn of Promise" \*HYMN OF CENTERING **UMH 707** Hymn History: The words and music to this hymn were written by Natalie Sleeth. She was born in Evanston, Illinois in 1930. She began to study the piano at the age of four. Natalie went on to Wellesley College where she earned a BA in music theory in 1952. She married Rev. Ronald Sleeth, a United Methodist Minister and Professor of Homiletics at several seminaries. The couple was living in Denver, Colorado when Ron developed cancer. Natalie composed this hymn shortly before he died. Ron requested that it be sung at his funeral in 1985. It was published in 1986. Natalie was inspired by a poem of T. S. Eliot which had a phrase "in my beginning is my end." She used those words to express the hope of God's promises. This popular hymn is found in the hymnals of the United Church of Canada and the United Christ of Christ as well as the United Methodist hymnal.


