PASTOR'S LETTER

How does a weary world rejoice? We root ourselves in ritual.

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? - Isaiah 43:19a

Happy New Year! How have you traditionally celebrated New Year's. Do you gather with friends and/or family? Is it your tradition to order pizza and play games till midnight or to cook a big fancy meal? Do you watch your favorite TV channel that shows highlights from the past year all the way up till when the ball drops in New York City Times Square? Does someone offer a toast? Do you make any New Year's resolutions?

Traditions and rituals are important. They connect us to one another in community, they shape our understanding of ourselves and the world, they help to give life meaning. This is especially true in our lives of faith. Worship, singing hymns together, receiving communion, praying the Lord's prayer, renewing our vows every time there is a baptism, lighting Advent candles - all these practices and more work at a deep level giving us a foundation and providing stability in a world of change. When scripture is read in worship, it not only connects us to one another through a shared experience, it connects us to countless people from biblical times to worshippers over the past two thousand years!

I am grateful for all the traditions and rituals that are so much a part of Mentor UMC that Pastor Ivy and I have gotten to experience in our first six months with you. The pictures in this Weekly Update highlight some of those events. Thank you for being the Body of Christ!

One of the really cool things about traditions and rituals is that they prepare us for new things. In Isaiah 43:19a, God says, "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" When we regularly engage in the communal practices of our faith, the stability and foundation that results gives us the ability to better perceive the new thing God is doing. When we are confident in God's faithfulness that is recalled and celebrated through ritualist practices, we are less anxious about the future because we know it is in God's hands.

In addition to Isaiah 43, we will hear Luke 2:21-38 in worship this last Sunday of 2023. We will watch and listen as Joseph and Mary take their 8-day old baby Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem to be circumcised, named, and presented to the Lord. It is a ritual that began back in the days of Moses, more than a thousand years prior to Jesus' birth. It is an essential part of the story that

begins to shape Jesus' identity. How have religious rituals and traditions shaped your identity? How do they help a weary world rejoice?

Thank you again for a fantastic beginning to our ministry together at Mentor United Methodist Church. I can't wait to see what new things God will do in this new year.
