Hymn History: This version of an Afro-American spiritual was arranged by Henry Thacker "Harry" Burleigh. Born in 1866 in Erie, Pa., Burleigh was a composer, arranger, and vocalist. He was known for his rich baritone voice. He was the first African-American to be a soloist at St. George's Episcopal Church in New York City. He met the famed composer Antonin Dvorak at the National Conservatory of Music of America in NYC where Burleigh was a student (and Dvorak the Director) and introduced him to the traditional music of African-Americans. Dvorak incorporated themes from both African-Americans and Native Americans in his famous New World Symphony. Burleigh died in Stamford, Connecticut in 1949.
