Hymn History: The words to this hymn were written by Rev. Samuel Walcott. Born in Connecticut in 1813, he was ordained a minister in the Congregationalist Church. He served several churches in lifetime, including Plymouth Congregation (now UCC) Church in Cleveland (which later reformed as a church in Shaker Heights). He was a descendant of Oliver Walcott, a signer of the Declaration of Independence. He didn't begin writing hymns until he was 56 and wrote over 200. He died in Massachusetts in 1886.
