Hymn History: The words to this hymn were written by Michael Perry. He was born in Beckenham, Kent, England in 1942. He was ordained as a Church of England clergyman in Liverpool. He served churches in the counties of Lancashire and Hampshire, and finally in his home county of Kent. He married Beatrice Mary in 1967 and they had two children, Helen and Simon. Perry composed over 300 hymns and helped produce two hymn books, Psalm Praise and Hymns for Today's Church. The melody of the hymn we are singing today is from the Jupiter section of Gustav Holst's work The Planets. Sadly, Michael Perry died at age 54 of an inoperable brain tumor in Tombridge, Kent, England in 1996.
