"Great Is Thy Faithfulness"

Hymn History: The words to this hymn were written by Thomas Chisholm. He was born in a log cabin in Kentucky in 1866. He was educated in a one room schoolhouse and became the teacher at that school at age 16. Though he had no more formal education, Chisholm became a Methodist Minister in 1893. He gave up the ministry after one year due to poor health. He moved with his family, wife and two daughters, to a farm in Indiana. He sold insurance for a while and later moved to New Jersey. He wrote over 1,200 sacred poems of which 800 were published. He wrote the poem that became the words to Great Is Thy Faithfulness in 1923. It was put to music that same year by William Runyan, a friend of Chisholm and fellow Methodist Minister. Chisholm said there was no great occasion that inspired the poem, just the everyday appreciation of God's Grace. Chisholm died in New Jersey in 1960.
