Hymn History: The words to this hymn were written by Isaac Watts. A prolific writer of hymns, many of Watts' works are in our hymnal. He was also a Congregationalist Minister, and theologian. He was born in Southampton, England in 1674. His father, also a Congregationalist was considered a Non-Conformist by the Church of England. As a result, Watts was not permitted to attend Oxford or Cambridge, he went to a Non-Conformist academy instead. We always sing Watts lyrics to "Joy to the World" at the end of our traditional Christmas Eve service. On his death, Watt's papers were donated to Yale University in the then Colony of Connecticut, which was founded by Puritans and Congregationalists. Watts died in Stoke Newington (Greater London) in 1748. After his death, a monument to him was placed in Westminster Abbey.
