Pastor's Letter

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Acts 2:42

What would happen if we were a FULLY DEVOTED, Acts 2:42, church? I'm not just referring to this congregation, but to the CHURCH, the body of Christ. What if we were fully <u>devoted</u> to learning from those first-hand witnesses to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, <u>devoted</u> to gathering for mutual encouragement and upbuilding one another in our discipleship, <u>devoted</u> to the breaking of bread where there's a seat at every table to experience Jesus' presence, and <u>devoted</u> to praying for the church, the world, and all those in need? I believe that we would experience a profound transformation—not just individually, not just within the church, but throughout the world.

This is what it means to be an Easter people. Consider the devotion of those first followers who took up the mantle of Jesus following the resurrection. It was because of their devotion (aka commitment) to these spiritual practices that led to the spread of the gospel. This is one of the most magnificent "acts of the apostles" following Jesus' resurrection. It was that devotion that turned the world upside down.

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit called a new community into existence—a community characterized by fellowship, worship, unity, and generosity. Community—a collection of ordinary people going about everyday life but with an extraordinary commitment to one another—is what the story of the early church is all about. What if this were to be OUR story—the story told about Mentor United Methodist Church, the story of us as Caring Servants, the story of the church's witness to the world?

Throughout the book of Acts, when people respond to the good news, there is always a corresponding mention of a larger fellowship or an occasion to show hospitality to others. The apostles spent the majority of their time maintaining close connections with communities of faith—teaching, breaking bread, praying, and lifting up the fellowship of believers. Salvation in this context was never individualistic...but involved, belonging to and participating in a larger, much more expansive community. More often than not we don't question biblical stories of people hearing God in a vision or being healed in the presence of the apostles. Could it be that it's easier to accept miraculous stories than those about Jesus' followers taking care of one another in self-giving and harmonious ways? After all, that's so ordinary.

The amazing thing isn't that all those fabulous things happened, but that the fledgling church survived at all! These early believers struggled to stay centered on the presence of Jesus after he had disappeared from their midst. The world in which they persisted in teaching, breaking bread, praying, and strengthening their bonds of fellowship was hostile to their message. To maintain their small, growing community they had to SHARE—share their faith, share their table, share their resources (including money), and share their very selves. It was the only way forward. Behind all that activity was a group of people so convinced that God was doing something NEW, that they commit themselves to a whole new way of living...TOGETHER!

It seems to me that we are living in a liminal time where the culture we live in is hostile to the good news, where those vying for power distort the gospel for the sake of their own agenda, and where we struggle to stay focused on what really matters. Simply put, the way forward for any church awash in a cultural mess is to DEVOTE ourselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and pray. It is only through the power of the Holy Spirit and those faith practices that the church will not only survive...but thrive!

<u>Together</u> may we be fully devoted followers of Jesus!
