INSPIRE: INSPIRING OTHERS - MATTHEW 25:1-13

The parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins is our lectionary scripture passage for this week. The passage is full of history and Eastern wedding traditions. The story has symbolism for how we should **be prepared** for the coming of Christ. It focuses on the consequences of not being prepared and the privileges afforded when you are prepared.

I watch "Say Yes to the Dress" often—the TV show about women selecting a wedding gown. I also watch a show called "Four Weddings" where the wedding plans, from start to finish, are critiqued and judged. Well, this passage is right up my alley because the description of how **we should prepare for Christ's return** are compared as wedding preparations of Palestinian/ eastern ceremonies. Jesus compares our preparedness for heaven with the detailed rituals of a wedding, with the church/us being the bride and Christ being the groom. Yet the main thrust is **BE PREPARED!**

"Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise answered, saying, What if there isn't enough for us and you? You go rather to those who sell, and buy for yourselves." (Matthew 25:8)

After reading the story, you will see the unfortunate decision five of the women made, and the better decision that five made. The women without a reserve of oil, their lack of **preparation results** in being left behind and too late for salvation. It's a hard truth to grapple with, not receiving salvation, yet we must realize that God provides opportunity after opportunity, chance after chance, opening after opening for us!





<u>Why wouldn't the wise women share their oil?</u> Well, this parable has so many nuances that are unfamiliar to our understanding of weddings, that we may get caught up in the differences. Yet the crux of the story is **PREPAREDNESS** and **EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED**. The oil is a symbol of a life of faith. The oil is a sign of a healthy relationship with God. The oil represents the discipline, consistency and reliance that we

must-have in the Christian life. And if you don't have a faithful prayer life, when tragedy strikes, you will not **be ready**. This is hard to hear, and certainly, even harder if experienced.

When I visit our members who are not able to attend in person, I always remind them of how special their relationship with God is. I tell them that your faith really matters when you're not able to come to church, sing in the choir, cook, usher, teach Sunday School, open your Bible. All the ways we daily live out our faith PREPARE US for a strong, enduring Christian life. PREPAREDNESS!!! Preparedness, not for the worst but preparedness for the best, preparedness for what is yet to come, preparedness for the future.

I cannot stop counting how many spirituals I know that speak directly of this passage's theme of being ready. Three off the top of my head are: 1) "Good news, Chariot's comin', And I don't want it to leave me behind", 2) "Keep Your Lamps Trimmed and Burning, the time is drawing nigh", 3) "I want to be ready, I want to be ready to walk in Jerusalem just like John." Yet, the best for me is one that is hard to find the author and consistent lyrics. It is a song from my college choir days entitled: "I Wanna Be Ready." I recall the choir receiving a standing ovation each time it was sung. The lyrics are: *I wanna be ready, I wanna be ready, Lord, I wanna be ready, ready to put on my long, white robe. [Refrain].* The verses say: *I would not be a sinner, I'll tell you the reason why; cause if my Lord should call on me, I wouldn't be ready to die.*

And it repeats the refrain and then says: I would not be a liar, I'll tell you the reason why; cause if my Lord should call on me, I wouldn't be ready to die. [Refrain] I would not be a gambler, I'll tell you the reason why; cause if my Lord should call on me I wouldn't be ready to die. [Refrain]

Jesus' words are beckoning us to be ready always, to live so that we give our best every day, always ready for the unexpected. — Pastor Ivy
