Pastor's Letter



There are significant women through-out the Bible, and God has lifted this particular story to a height that deserves a place in the Bible index. Naomi, Ruth and Orpah are the main characters of the beginning story of the book of Ruth. The story goes that Ruth comes to a crossroads point, a decision time in where she must answer the question: Where Do We Go from Here?

All of us are forced to use our skill, ability, experience, background, etc., to make decisions in life. Each day we are faced with choices, sometimes life-changing choices. In verse 6 of



chapter one, Naomi, the mother-in-law, hears that the famine of her hometown, Judah, is over: "the Lord has visited his people and given them food." She tries to influence her two daughters-in-law to leave her and go back to their former lives. Oprah does decide to return to her home, but Ruth decides not to leave Naomi. In fact, Ruth decides to go with Naomi and adopt the faith that she has seen in Naomi. She says

"For wherever you go, I will go, and wherever you live, I will live; your people will be my people, and your God will be my God"

(1:16). Ruth has to review her past life: -her husband has died, -father-in-law died, she is a different race than her mother-in-law, she's young, lots of variables in her choices before her.

I think that if every time we had to make a decision, big or small, we would reflect on "where do I go from here?" that questioning would provide an opportunity to choose the right and not the wrong, the good and not the bad, the wider not the narrower. And like Ruth, we all have extensive backgrounds and former life experiences that play into our vision of our future. So God is showing us through Ruth that we must do all we can to stay in connection with the body of Christ. Ruth could have left her mother-in-law and the life she built with her, but **she decided to look forward to the future, the possibilities of going forward and not backwards** (as we know returning to our past habits is so easy but not always beneficial). Where do we go from here? We should go, with discernment, where God is present, active, and alive in the people around us. **We should go and also take people with us** on this journey with Christ. They and we are the better for the connection we would have! —*Pastor lvy*
