Pastor's Letter

STORM PROOF: HOW DO WE PROCEED?



Who is in control? God is. What is guiding us? God will. How do we proceed? With God.

Simple answers to complex questions. Fortunately, we can read in God's word that God controls, guides and provides

process for us. In all of our doings, we must submit to God's authority over creation.

The **storms** in this series, and the **storms** in our individual lives, deal with the upheavals of life conditions. Those "**storms**" that overtake us and cause us to question 'how much or if any control that we have over our lives.'

When we live believing that we are the controllers of our very own fate, we delude ourselves. We delude ourselves into a false sense of security and a false sense of abilities.

For three weeks, this series encouraged us to have a strengthened faith or "the Blessed Assurance" of God's provision. Being "Storm Proof" should be our goal as a Christian. We should grow so much in our faith that we can see storms coming, feel storms brewing and then be able to brace ourselves knowing that Jesus will be with us. STORM PROOF, STORM PROOF!

Their song boasts that **storms** do not and cannot overtake us because we live knowing God is in control, guides and orders our steps in sunny, cold, hot or **storm**y weather. Be






Alzheimer's Walk 2025


