Pastor's Letter

He Shall be Called Prince of Peace

"Peace, peace," they say, when there is no peace. – Jeremiah 8:11b

Every year in Advent, I am reminded of Buz, a long-time member of York UMC, my first appointment in East Ohio. In my first year, during Advent, Buz made an appointment to meet with me. When he came into my office, I could see he was dealing with some kind of pain, some kind of heaviness on his heart. He shut the door and sat down, slumped in the chair right in front of me. He began, "Pastor Steve, I just want you to know that I get really depressed and even angry in December each year. My wife died on December 15th five years ago, and so that's part of it, but also I'm tired of all this talk about peace in the season of Advent and Christmas!" Buz shook his head with visible turmoil and went on, "All you ever hear about in the news is violence and hatred and war and corruption! There is no peace! Why do we have to sing all these songs about peace on earth and peace in my heart and Jesus is the Prince of Peace? There's too much suffering and brokenness and pain!"

Buz is not alone. I have heard others express similar laments in this season of Advent. At some level, I expect that in our own ways we can all relate. Don't we all struggle in the gap between the peace we pray for and the lack of peace we see and experience every day? About 2600 years ago, the Prophet Jeremiah felt God calling him to cry out about the lack of peace in the face of false rhetoric from leaders saying there is peace. In today's language, Jeremiah is saying, "Put your money where your mouth is!" Or, to use an expression that is often attributed to Mahatma Gandhi, "Be the peace you want to see in the world".

I believe Buz had a deep yearning for true peace in the world and in his own experience of grief. I believe his pain was exacerbated by a sense of powerlessness. After all, what can one person do about all the violence, division, war, and suffering in the world?


That's where Isaiah and Luke come in. During their lifetimes, respectively, peace seemed to be as unattainable as it was in Jeremiah's time. However, Isaiah heard God speak a promise:

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given,
and the government will be on his shoulders.
And he will be called
Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
Of the greatness of his government and peace
there will be no end. – Isaiah 9:6-7a

And, Luke testified in his gospel that indeed God's promise had been fulfilled in Jesus—his birth, life, teaching, death, and resurrection. Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. He overcomes sin and brokenness with forgiveness and healing. He defeats hatred and divisions with transforming love. Fear and anxiety lose their grip when he breathes hope, vision, and mission into his followers.

Jesus is the Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. In and through him is the hope of the world. That's good news!

Christmas Carol History

Hymn 237 - Sing We Now of Christmas



This hymn is based on a traditional French carol. The melody goes back as far as the fifteenth century. It was titled Noel Nouvelet which translates into Christmas Comes Anew. The English translation comes from the seventeenth century. The carol references the birth of Jesus and the angels announcement to the shepherds. The three Kings from the east are also mentioned. This carol was harmonized by the Englishman Martin Shaw (1875-1958) in 1928. The French in the fifteenth century often sang their carols in front of creches that adorned many French homes as well as town squares. The region of Provence was noted for their creches made out of clay. The scenes included the Holy Family, the shepherds, the Wise Men, the animals and often the local townspeople thus showing the entire village converging on the Nativity.
