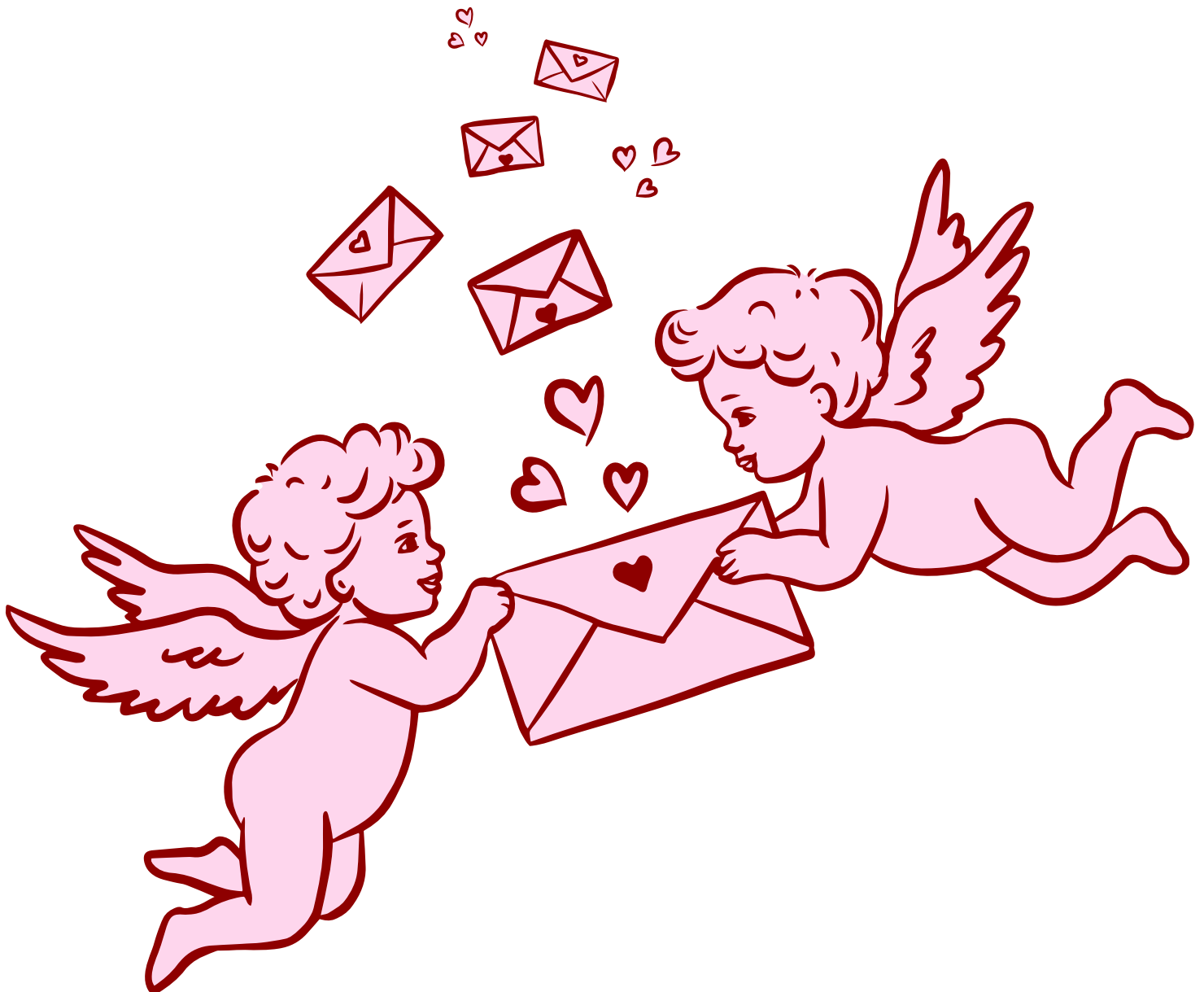

Pastor's Letter

Hello Siblings in Christ,

This week's text, Matthew 22:34-40, is one of my favorites, and if you have ever heard me preach or teach, you have most likely heard me say what Jesus taught in this passage. We are to love God and love our neighbor as we love ourselves. As I reread this familiar passage, I am drawn to how we are to love God: *with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your mind*. Jesus was quoting the *Shema* from Deuteronomy 6:4-5, the basic teachings of Jewish belief and what they are to teach their children.

When we read the first part of this passage, we learn that Jesus had left the Sadducees, the priests, speechless causing the Pharisees, made up mostly of laymen, to meet together to test Jesus on His knowledge of Jewish law. These leaders were trying to protect their power and feared who Jesus was and how people were listening to Him.

This past week I heard a saying that I think is relevant for 2026: Jesus was political and not partisan. If we look at the context of the time when Jesus lived and when the Gospels were written, we learn that the Roman government was suppressing the Jewish people. When Christians talk about how we are to love one another regardless of a person's heritage, skin color, status in society, or any of the other myriad of things that make us all different from one another, it has to do with how human beings are to be treated. Jesus did not teach one side against another when He said that we are to love our neighbor as we love ourselves. When we love ourselves, do we base that love on our heritage? Our skin color? Our status in society?

If we proclaim that we are followers of Jesus Christ, then what is holding us back from loving our neighbor, even those who are different from us, as we love ourselves? I have witnessed how you, the faith community of Mentor UMC, have shown love towards your neighbor without making it a partisan issue, but one of justice and compassion. Let us remain steadfast in how we treat our fellow human beings...in how we are to love like Jesus.

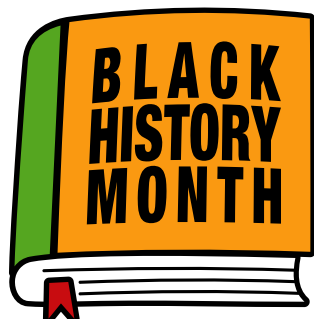

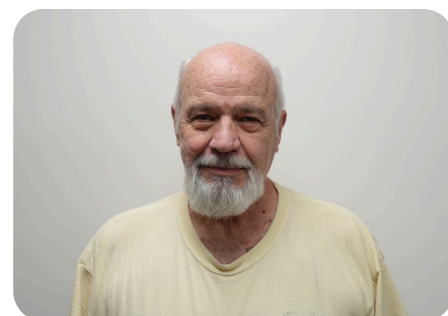


9:15 AM Chapel Service

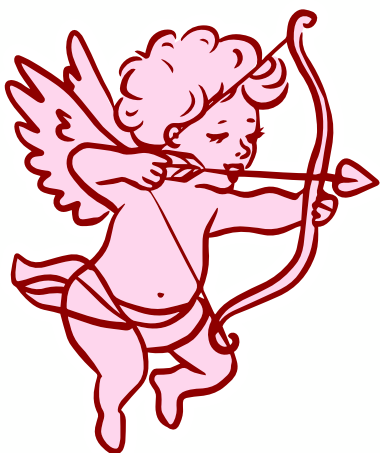
Snacks for Theatre Students
