Pastor's Letter



*glory confronts us
glory shapes us
glory shines through us*

Jesus, again, speaks to us in Matthew 5:13-16 as we close our series of "Glory Revealed." Week one we explored "Glory Confronts Us", then week two: "Glory Shapes Us" and now, "GLORY SHINES THROUGH US."

Glory is recognition. Yes, the ultimate reason for our existence is to bring recognition, identification, glory to God. In all ways, our purpose in living is to glorify God in everything that we do, think and experience. As this RECOGNITION confronts, shapes and shines through us, we become models for others to emulate. When we glorify God, others are touch by our glorification.

In this scripture passage, Jesus describes believers in two ways. He says that we are the salt of the earth and we are the light of the world. We, like salt, are obligated to preserve and season life with our spirit. We should be sprinkling ourselves, like salt from a salt shaker, over others every day. As salt pulls out the flavor in food we are to pull out the best in others and we do that with encouragement, support and care.

Jesus also says that we are the light of the world. We are tasked to illuminate, brighten and reveal in dark areas of life. That elementary, beginning song that many of us learned years ago... "This little light of mine, I'm going to let it shine" can serve as a inspiring chant for us. And even after all these years of letting 'our little light shine' we can cause others to see Christ and accept God's great love for all. In doing so God's love is revealed and shines through us! Separately, salt and light bring about changes. So, we are called to be changers, changers of society, changers of culture, changers of opinion. As believers, our lives are spent recognizing God! Not us, not our job, not our bank account, not our children and family, but God, and God only, deserves the glory.






