PASTOR'S LETTER

What does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God - Micah 6:8b

This passage from the prophet Micah was written about 800 years before Jesus was born. That's almost 3,000 years ago! Yet, its message and truth hold true still today. God calls us to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God. Of these three, most Christians are least familiar with justice. What is your understanding of Justice? What does it look like to "do justice"? What does the Bible say about justice? How is justice part of what it means to be a follower of Jesus?

These questions and others are at the heart of our new worship series that starts this Sunday, January 14—"Justice or Just Us?" I invite you to embrace this opportunity to explore the meaning of justice as it pertains to our call as Christians. We will begin with Luke 10:25-37 where "an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus." He asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus asks him "What is written in the law?" The man responds, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." In Matthew's version of this passage, a lawyer asks Jesus, "Which commandment in the law is the greatest?" and Jesus recites the law "Love the Lord your God…and your neighbor as yourself."

I love these passages. Whenever I find myself feeling stuck in my faith, challenged by difficult questions, seeking clarity around current social issues, faced with the-lesser-of-two-evils kinds of decisions, I find my bearings from these passages. I take a deep breath and remind myself *love God, love your neighbor* and I feel a sense of grace and assurance. But then, I hear God calling me back to justice, Do justice, love mercy, walk humbly. It turns out that part of loving our neighbors is doing justice!

In his book, *Covenant Discipleship*, David Lowes Watson defines acts of piety as ways of loving God and acts of mercy as ways of loving neighbor. He goes on to emphasize the importance of engaging in both personal and public acts of piety and mercy. For example, when we gather as the body of Christ to worship, we are engaging in a public act of piety. When we spend time alone praying, we are engaging in a private act of piety. Both of these deepen our love for God. Likewise, when we feed the hungry, we are engaging in a personal act of mercy which Watson calls an act of compassion. A public act of mercy, Watson calls an act of justice. Acts of justice often seek to address the root causes of suffering in our world. In other words, we are called to not only feed the hungry, but also to confront the parts of our system that contribute to people not being able to provide for themselves in the first place.

Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., whose birthday we as a nation celebrate every January 15, gave his life seeking to confront the evils of racism and racial injustice. His commitment to non-violence protest as a way to change racial laws in our government system is a notable example of our call as Christians to "do justice".

I hope this series will help me personally and all of us collectively as a church, grow in our commitment to do justice.
