Pastor's Letter

Glory Revealed – Glory Confronts Us

The people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.

– Matthew 4:16 NIV

What do you think of when you hear the word “glory”? I’m reminded of growing up and hearing my dad mockingly say, “Who gets the glory? Who gets the glory?” He’d say this whenever my brothers would be arguing over something, each one insisting that he was right!

When we hear the word glory in everyday life, we usually think of bright lights and big moments. We think of glory days, championship trophies, standing ovations, red carpets—moments when someone is seen, celebrated, and lifted up. In our culture, glory tends to shine where success shines.

But Matthew tells us something very different. He says, “The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death, light has dawned.”

Notice where the light shows up. Not in palaces. Not in power centers. Not in places already glowing with success. The light, God’s glory, dawns in places of darkness. In overlooked regions. Among ordinary people. Along dusty roads, in fishing villages, in lives that are weary and waiting.

In other words, God’s glory doesn’t just shine where things are already impressive. God’s glory shines where light is needed most. And when we see God’s glory, when God’s glory is revealed, we are often confronted. It changes us. What we see cannot be unseen! What we come to know cannot be dismissed. Our lives, like the disciples’ and like so many throughout history, take on new direction, new focus, and new identity.

This week, we start a new three-week series, “Glory Revealed.” My hope is that together we will come to see and know God’s glory more fully through the lens of Jesus, or in other words, through the lens of the cross. We will explore how God’s Glory confronts us, shapes us, and shines through us. We are invited to look for glory not only in what’s bright and celebrated—but in what’s quiet, hidden, struggling, and hungry for light. Because that’s often where God chooses to dawn.
