PASTOR'S LETTER

AND A VOICE CAME FROM HEAVEN: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

- MARK 1:11 -

"How Does a Weary World Rejoice? We Trust in our Belovedness"



Jesus comes up from the water of baptism and the audible voice of God announces: "This is my beloved son in whom I am well pleased." This statement marks the beginning point of Jesus' public ministry to the world. Yes, Jesus' birth certainly points to his

deity, his purpose and his role in the trinity. Yet, at this juncture of water baptism and public exposure we witness the mission of Jesus being fulfilled. God says to us that the act of baptism is pleasing in God's sight and through it we become the beloved children of God.

Baptism is the initiatory act of the church that is the public starting point of our membership into the Body of Christ, the fellowship of the believers. And as Jesus pleased God with baptism, we too please God with this act of obedience.

It is true that we seek to please others with our skills, clout or smarts. Yet all that we do and try to do often misses the mark. For God wants to take up residence within us and then live with us throughout eternity.

Pleasing God is why we do what we do!

I recall a great scene in the original "Color Purple" movie that points to the 'belovedness' that we can trust. As two women, Celie and Shug Avery, converse as they walk through a meadow of purple wildflowers, the paraphrased is: "God does not just want us to walk past the color Purple without seeing it, acknowledging and voicing our pleasure with it.' They talk about how pleased God is with God's handiwork and creation of life. And I hear between the lines that God sees us, yes us, yes me, yes you, and is pleased with the creation that God made. Friends, others may not be happy or content, or even able to recognize the beauty within us. Yet, we can rest assured that God is pleased and happy even with us and our lives.

It is in the first verse of the song "Blessed assurance" that we can find comfort in times of doubt. We can be comforted by the lyrics saying that we have a 'blessed assurance that Jesus is mine. O what a foretaste of glory divine! Heir of salvation, purchased of God, born of His Spirit, washed in His blood." We can trust in our belovedness by the promise of God to never leave us nor forsake us in the time of trouble. Trusting and relying on the belovedness of God is a helpful reminder of God's provision to see our future and see our present-day misery. Remember that you are beloved and you matter to God! - Pastor lvy

Luke 3:15-18, 21-22 NIV 15 The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Messiah. 16 John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one who is more powerful than I will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 17 His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire." 18 And with many other words John exhorted the people and proclaimed the good news to them. 21 When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened 22 and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."
