## PASTOR'S LETTER

Greetings Siblings in Christ,

When I was a child growing up in the country, I always remember this time of year and how it related to the corn growing in the fields, especially the sweet corn growing in our garden. We knew that it wouldn't be long before we could enjoy the tasty treat of fresh sweet corn as long as the stalks were "knee high by the fourth of July!" For those of you who are my children's ages, we didn't get to enjoy sweet corn until the end of July or August because produce wasn't as readily accessible as it is now. As an educator, this time of year was bittersweet. Fourth of July meant that summer vacation was on the downward slope, and I would have to start thinking about planning for the fall semester and the winter concerts!

At Mentor UMC, this first Sunday of July marks the beginning of a new sermon series titled, "Praying for Strangers." While this sounds rather daunting, I want to point out that it does not say praying WITH strangers, but FOR, which sounds a lot less scary, in my humble opinion. The book for which we are loosely basing our series has the same title written by River Jordan. I have been enjoying the book this summer as Jordan recounts her various stories of praying for strangers. As I am reading, I can see the allure of what Jordan did as her new year's resolution the year her sons were deployed for war in Iraq and Afghanistan.

One of my takeaways from her experience is how something that may seem so small, praying a simple prayer of blessing for someone, had such a meaningful and personal impact on those for whom she prayed. This is an excellent reminder to me about how prayer is so very powerful. As a person of faith, I cannot imagine someone not being able to rely on the power of prayer. My relationship with God is something that I do not take for granted. And I hope you feel the same. This Sunday's theme is connection, and our scripture is John 4:4-29. We will read the story of the Samaritan woman at the well meeting Jesus. Two people who would not likely meet under normal circumstances make a connection and provide an excellent example of how God's grace and love can impact our lives to help us experience transformation. When I think about praying for strangers and the Samaritan woman, I am drawn to how she had no idea who she was talking to at the well, but Jesus knew things about her that were surprising to her.

I am only about one third of the way through Jordan's book, and I have not encountered a story where she was able to tell one of the strangers she met any specifics about their life. Maybe that is only something Jesus is able to do. I encourage you to consider reading the book and more importantly pray for a stranger today or maybe every day.
