Pastor's Letter

Follow the Fire, The Scenic Route

So God led the people by the roundabout way of the wilderness – Exodus 13:18a (NRSV)

This week, we continue on the road in our series, *Road Trip: On The Go With God.* We will reflect on two passages of scripture from Exodus 13 and Acts 2 (Pentecost). The Exodus passage is part of the story of God delivering God's people, the Israelites, from slavery in Egypt. If you have ever watched the 1956 movie, "The Ten Commandments," you have, branded in your mind's eye, the iconic image of Moses, played by Charlton Heston, boldly striking the Red Sea with his staff and the waters miraculously parting for God's people to go through. It is powerful. In fact, it is a story of inspiration and identity-making that is told and referenced over and over again throughout the Old Testament. It is a reminder of God's power and faithfulness that reminds us to trust and follow God even into a turbulent sea while being chased by enemies!

But, did you know, that they didn't have to cross the Red Sea? Seriously! They could have taken a land route that would have been shorter! Exodus 13:18 says that God led the people (intentionally) by the roundabout way of the wilderness. Why? Why did God take them through the Red Sea and into the wilderness where they ended up wandering around for 40 years—a whole generation! That's a question for us to ponder and it's one that I will reflect on more in my sermon this week. For now, this passage has me thinking about the value God places on the journey as much as the destination.

It seems that God is saying to the Israelites *SLOW DOWN, take the scenic route, don't just try to get to your destination as fast as you can, you have much to learn on the way.* It is an important message for all of us in our current age and context. We need to take time for sabbath, time to reflect, time to pause from the everyday demands that keep us always on the go.

In the United Methodist Church, and similarly in several other denominations, clergy are encouraged to take between six weeks and six months of renewal leave once every six years. My last renewal leave was eight years ago. I am grateful for our Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) that has given me their unanimous, strong support to take renewal leave this summer. Please see their April announcement re-published in this Weekly Update. I look forward to taking this time of renewal leave to pause from the daily demands of ministry, to reflect, spend more time with family, and be renewed in ways that require simply slowing down. I am grateful for your prayers and support.

Pastor Steve Renewal Leave

We hope this message finds you well and thriving in your faith journey. We are pleased to announce that Pastor Steve will be taking renewal leave from July 1 to August 26, 2025.

The Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) unanimously approved Pastor Steve's request at their March 25 meeting, and he has also received support from our District Superintendent, Rev. Angela Lewis. As outlined in the United Methodist Book of Discipline, renewal leave may include study, travel, spiritual retreat, or other restorative activities that enhance ministry effectiveness. This opportunity for rest, recharge, and spiritual refocus is encouraged for all clergy in the United Methodist Church every six years. Pastor Steve's last renewal leave was in 2017, making this a timely and much-deserved break.

Pastor Steve plans to travel to Virginia to visit family and explore the Appalachian Trail, and to Canada, where he and his wife Cara share a cabin with her siblings. He will also spend time reading, studying, working on home projects, and enjoying special outings with his sons, Eli and Atticus.

During Pastor Steve's leave, Pastor Ivy will serve as Senior Pastor, with Pastor Tammy assisting in pastoral responsibilities. Preaching and worship will be led by Pastor Ivy and Pastor Tammy, along with guest preachers for two or three Sundays. Rev. Barb Holzhauser will provide pastoral care assistance as needed.

Pastor Steve has expressed that he is not feeling burned out and feels blessed to serve as the Sr. Pastor at Mentor United Methodist Church. He remains energized and excited about our future together, attributing part of his vitality to proactive renewal leave.
