PASTOR'S LETTER

WANDERING HEART: Figuring Out Faith with Peter –



You and I, together, could certainly make many references to theological and philosophical conclusions about the word "Hope." This week, I was first drawn to pull on my memory of the great German theologian, Paul Tillich's book "The Courage to Be," where he describes courage as how we accept our anxiety and find the source of moving from anxiety through guilt, through trauma, through wealth to acceptance of self. He describes the Christian as having the Courage to be.... "The courage to be is rooted in the God who appears when God has disappeared in the anxiety of doubts."

Yet a great insight on the word "HOPE" and a less cumbersome depiction can be found in one of my top five movie favorites: The Shawshank Redemption. I love *The Godfather*, *Coming to America*, *Doc Hollywood*, *Malcolm X* and a little movie called *Picture Perfect* with Jennifer Aniston, but I digress.

In Shawshank, Red, the Morgan Freeman character, has two great statements on "HOPE" that I believe zeroes in on our Wandering Heart theme this week: AND I HOPE. The reason why Red is so against Hope early on in the movie, is he understands the power of the word HOPE and the potent, active agent in HOPE.

Ah, I will never forget the somber impression I felt, years ago, when I read the words "Low aim is failure" by long-serving president and great professor of Morehouse College, Rev. Dr.


Benjamin Elijah Mays. Those words hit me like a ton of bricks. With the privileges and success I had been afforded in life, so like many, I never questioned 'aim' or amibition. But I learned that HOPE is encouraged and formed by surroundings. So, when the surroundings are desolate, primitive, lacking, HOPE is like Red says: 'Hope is a dangerous thing. Hope can drive a man insane.' And when surroundings are fertile, supportive



and potential fields, HOPE thrives. So it is imperative that those with HOPE must share, yes share that HOPE that you've been privy to own.


And we know that later in the movie, Red (free from prison and riding the Greyhound bus) moves to a healthier statement on HOPE:

I find I'm so excited, I can barely sit still or hold a thought in my head. I think it's the excitement only a free man can feel, a free man at the start of a long journey whose conclusion is uncertain. **I hope** I can make it across the border. **I hope** to see my friend and shake his hand. **I hope** the Pacific is as blue as it has been in my dreams. **I hope**.



Friends, I believe that hope is tangible. hope is real. Not a childlike optimism, not a whimsical belief in fantasy, and not a dreamy faith in tomorrow and what is to come. Yet, HOPE is the foundation in having belief. HOPE is the substratum. It is what propels us to fly, to jump, to leap, to walk, to crawl even. HOPE is the necessary element in moving you from nothing to point A, from zero to one. So, I send you HOPE in the Christ that gives life, that gives peace, that gives joy! My Easter prayer is that we all have HOPE in the bright future that God sees and has for our taking. *-Pastor Ivy*


