PASTOR'S LETTER

Wandering Heart: PRAISE THE MOUNT LENTEN SCRIPTURE FOR THIS WEEK: Matthew 16:13-20 and Psalm 19



As our Methodist founder, John Wesley, is herald for the concept that we live in perpetual grace (whether prevenient, justifying or sanctifying), I certainly do believe that we spend our lives being rescued by God. Over and over, it seems to be, that we are rescued, saved, restored from hurt, harm and danger by the tender mercy of God. And that, to me, is, assuredly, worthy of our praise!

Throughout our lifetime, God affords us so many high points, successes and triumphs. So many that we often live confidently expecting God's goodness.
