# Pastor's Letter "Into the Wilderness"

The Spirit led Jesus up into the wilderness
- Matthew 4:1a

When I was in high school, I played trumpet in the band. Band was my favorite class. Our band director, Mr. Dill, was also my private trumpet instructor. He often told me I had talent and I thought I was pretty good, better than most of the other musicians, anyway. One day in band practice, Mr. Dill stopped us because someone was out of tune. I shook my head with a self-righteous smile, thinking, someone doesn't even know how to tune their instrument! Everyone took a moment to check their instruments and make adjustments. Mr. Dill gave us a downbeat and we started to play, only to be abruptly stopped again because someone was still out of tune. "Please, everyone, examine yourself, listen carefully, make sure you are in tune." I shook my head again, this time annoyed that we had to deal with such amateur talent! We started to play and again were stopped. After the fourth time, Mr. Dill looked at me and said, "Steve! You need to get in tune!" I was shocked and humbled. I was so sure that I was doing everything right that I didn't even bother to examine myself. You might say I was distracted by my own ego, convinced the problem was out there—not within me.

For our final Sunday in our series on distractions, we are invited to go with Jesus into the wilderness where the Spirit led him to be tempted. Jesus fasts for 40 days, symbolic of the 40 years the Israelites, Jesus' ancestors, spent in the wilderness to learn how to follow God and become God's people. Just before going into the wilderness, Jesus was baptized by his cousin John the Baptist. The voice of God was heard, "This is my son, the beloved with whom I am well pleased." What an affirmation! What an incredible claim! You'd think that "God's son" would not need to go into the wilderness to be tested. But that is where the Spirit led him to go. Why?

Before Jesus begins his public ministry, he spends 40 days in the wilderness. It is a time of self-reflection, a time of prayer and discernment, a time to wrestle with ultimate questions: What does it mean to be claimed by God as a beloved child? Am I truly God's son? If I am truly the long-awaited Messiah, the King of Kings, what does that look like? How am I called to live out my life embracing this identity and call?

If Jesus needed time in the wilderness for self-reflection—to gain clarity of vision and call and to be able to recognize when it was God speaking and when it was Satan or some other voice—then surely, we all must do the same. When was the last time you spent time outside in nature? When was the last time you prayed, "God, what does it mean for me to be called one of your beloved? God, what do you want me to do with the rest of my life?"

If we can get clarity on these questions, I'm sure we will be better equipped to overcome the many distractions that pull us away from the path we are called to follow. For me, it will be an opportunity to examine myself in hopes that I may be more in tune with God's plan for my life.
