The Lord be with you,

After a fantastic pilgrimage to England to see all things John Wesley, I am home. For those of you who follow the Mentor UMC Facebook page, there was a post each day from my experience. Our group was blessed to have Rev. Dr. Paul W. Chilcote share his valuable insight as we walked through the streets of London, Epworth, Bristol, and Oxford. I was able to have a truly immersive experience while in England.

On Saturday, October 18, we ended our time in Bristol with a service of word and communion. Dr. Chilcote shared a message of hope after reading Romans 15:13, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in faith so that you overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." In the words of Pastor Ivy, my eyes were leaking throughout his message on a day that I especially needed to be reminded of God's hope that is given through the power of the Holy Spirit. After the message, we were all invited to stand around the pulpit area where the bread and juice were laid on the same table that John Wesley used in the New Room. Bishop Jung shared the communion liturgy and then asked for "Deacon Tammy" to assist. Through my tears of blessing, I held the cup for my colleagues and friends as we shared in the Holy Mystery together in that sacred space.

The fact that this Sunday wraps up "The Lost Art of Gratitude" with inspiration from John Wesley's sermon, The Use of Money, is not lost on me. I believe the Holy Spirit has been at work to coordinate my pilgrimage with this series. John Wesley exemplified how to "give all you can" by living on a fixed income. When he managed to make more, he continued to live on that same amount and then gave away his extra money to those in need. Wesley recognized that God was the one who provided for him. This is still an idea that many Christ followers believe.

Part of giving all we can is how we put our faith into action. This means that another way of being good stewards of the resources that God grants each of us, is by serving those in need. The way we spend our time is a way to honor God. As your Pastor of Children & Family Ministries, I would be remiss if I did not invite you to spend your gift of time by blessing the children and youth in our faith community. As we approach 2026, I ask that you prayerfully consider the opportunity to serve as a coordinator of the Easter Egg Hunt, Vacation Bible School, Get Out Doors (G.O.D.) Camp, the Back to School Bash, Treat Street, or Sunday School Leader Recruiter. Since 2020, these programs have been without someone other than me leading the helm and the time has come for people to take on these leadership responsibilities.

May we all live into our Wesley heritage and embrace how we can gain all we can, save all we can, and give all we can.
