"Let's Start with Prayer"

Back in the spring I attended a conference for large United Methodist Churches. Pastors, staff, and lay leadership came from churches across the country to be renewed and learn effective ministry strategies for large congregations. Typical of conferences, a welcome packet was provided and throughout the conference pens and supplies were passed out. The supplies have been useful, then pens clutter my desk and drawers while doing little to improve my penmanship, and most of the resources are filed away in either a folder or the round file. But a little gem dropped in my welcome bag has been renewing and helpful, a little book by John Devries called, "Why Pray? 40 days—from words to relationship."

Day 14 reads...

I have a bit of "salesman" in me, so it always hurts to read the story of the ascension in Acts 1. It hurts because, from all sales perspectives, Jesus missed a golden opportunity—the disciples were at an emotional highpoint. After the crucifixion, they had never been lower, wondering what happened to the One they believed to be the Messiah. How their spirits soared as the resurrected Jesus appeared to them for a forty-day period! During that same time Jesus proved beyond any shadow of doubt that He was living and real. All of that climaxed on the glorious day of the ascension, as His followers watched Him rise until He was hidden from their sight by a cloud. Then two angels explained that Jesus would come again, in the same way they saw Him go. What a perfect moment to send someone out! What a motivation to go into the world and tell everyone of these marvelous things!

He goes on to share that instead of going out into the world and sharing, they followed Jesus' instruction and waited for the next 10 days, "They all joined together constantly in prayer." (Acts 1:14) But when the 10 days were up, the Holy Spirit came in a mighty way and then they went out and turned the world upside down.

Sometimes our approach to life and matters of ministry is to act first. But Jesus instructed us to pray first.

The prayer ministry of Mentor UMC offers prayer in a variety of ways, certainly one of these happens on Sunday mornings at 8:00. People gather in the Adams Parlor to pray. Before most of the morning activities begin, there is prayer resounding in the courts of heaven. The beauty of this prayer time is not in the elegance of prayers spoken, but in the humility of divine dependence. Worship leaders, choirs, Sunday School teachers, pastors, greeters, fellowship hour set up, ushers, etc. are covered in prayer. Prayers are offered for those who come to worship, whether first time or seasoned members. Not just for Sunday, but for the ministry that will follow throughout the coming week.

This prayer time is open to anyone that would like to come and pray for God's work to be done. And when we pray we acknowledge that "God is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine." (Ephesians 3:20)

Just as it's important to start your personal life in prayer, join us as we start Sunday and a new week in prayer.

Work has continued on electrical and plumbing needs. As of October 19th, heating was addressed so that some heat has been restored to limited loca-

tions. It is anticipated that the new heating units will be set in place on Friday, October 24 with connections and operation set for the following week.

Rain has continued to hamper work at other sites and slow scheduling of concrete and parking lot work. We are hopeful that the pouring of concrete and setting of underground parking lot retention basins will take place the week of October 27th.

In the coming weeks base parking materials will follow with some parking areas returned to service by early November. We continue to work toward opening phases of the remodel and new construction work as they are ready. The overall work is projected to be completed by early March. Updates will be provided as we move forward.

<u>Sorting or Preparing Food:</u> The church prepares food boxes for anywhere between 70—100 families in the Mentor areas which means there is a great need for people to sort and assemble food boxes so that every family sent to the church gets fed. Join together on Sunday, November 23rd, 12:15 p.m.—3 p.m. to help sort donated food and assemble food boxes for individual families. On Sunday, December 14th, 12:15 p.m.—3 p.m., we will join together to sort and assemble the Christmas food boxes.

<u>Distributing or Serving Food:</u> What better way to show Christ's love than to warmly welcome families into the church and provide them with food that will feed adults and children this season.
