As we enter the season of Fall, we continue to move forward with great opportunities. Following are three significant activities and opportunities:

- 1. Children's ministry will be ramping up with new and exciting curriculum and Sunday morning programming. And before long, we'll be in our remodeled classroom space. You don't want to miss out on this!
- 2. "Christian to the Core" will be a church-wide emphasis that will take us through the Sunday before Thanksgiving week. For 12-weeks we will be looking at practical ways we live out our lives of discipleship. There are small group opportunities and weekly worship emphasis as we look at life issues such as developing intimacy with God, finding purpose for life, and living our faith in our personal families.
- 3. During the season of construction we will have opportunities to show hospitality to those who come to "check out what's happening." While there are those who will officially greet and welcome, all of us have the opportunity/responsibility to show hospitality. Studies show that people will form their opinions in the first few moments of visiting a church, so we want to welcome all who come with warmth and show them the love of Christ.

I continue to marvel at the activity and life of the congregation. I am truly blessed to serve among you. Let's continue to do our best for God's Kingdom.

Internal demolition is nearing completion. The final sealing off of the construction areas has been completed with the installation of a temporary wall separating the old Choir Room space from the Annex. Passage from the sanctuary to the Fellowship Hall is now closed. Excavation has begun. The heating, ventilating and air conditioning work continues. As a result the Sanctuary will not have air conditioning for the rest of the cooling season. This work had to begin in

order to be working by heating season. Flat roofing of the existing church structures is nearing completion. Emphasis is being placed on preparing the Preschool classrooms for the beginning of the school year. Please watch signage for parking and door entrances as construction continues.

As parking may be limited on some Sundays, we request that those who are able park off-site and walk to the church. Parking is available in the rear of the strip mall to the east, Backyard Barbeque, and the music store across the street.

- - - - THROUGH THE YEARS - - - - -

Many cities in Europe were devastated after World War II. Americans came to the aid of millions of Europeans who lacked food, clothing, and shelter after the war. Nations such as France and Germany were especially targeted by U.S. relief agencies.

There was an organization known as Operation Democracy who helped get American aid to many locations in postwar Europe. This organization reached out to the Mentor area in 1948 for help. The man who stepped up first to lead in an assistance program was Rev. Richard Pettit, pastor of Mentor Methodist Church. Rev. Pettit served as our church's minister from 1947 through 1957. The Pettit Room is named in his honor.

One of the nations who needed help desperately was Finland. Indeed Rev. Pettit was asked to help the town of Suolahti, Finland with aid. He got the Mentor Civic Club to lead the effort in the Mentor area. Children collected food on Halloween night as they trick-or-treated. Many groups collected clothing to help. The proceeds from the Mentor-Fairport football game that fall (yes, Mentor played Fairport in those days) went to the effort. Suolahti is now part of the city of Aanekoski, Finland. A film was made of the relief aid being loaded in New York and unloaded in Finland. Sadly that film does not appear to exist anymore. Rev. Pettit was a great example of Methodists helping our world when a crisis occurs.

MISSION COMMISSION



The East Ohio Conference has been present with the people of West Africa long before the Ebola outbreak and we will be there long after Ebola is gone. As the disease spread, the 3Cs Mission is partnering with MedWish to send eight palettes of gloves, masks and gowns to both **Sierra Leone** and **Liberia**.

RELATIONSHIPS: Though many miles separate us we are bound together through love and faith in Jesus Christ. We continue to hear from friends at **Manjama Clinic**, in Harrisburg (Farmer to Farmer), at **Camphor Mission Station** and **Ganta Mission**. They tell us that people are scared, they remain at home and they pray.

Education is crucial in stopping the spread of the deadly Ebola outbreak because there is no cure or vaccine for the virus. So we pray together with them.

Prayers of protection for health care workers, family and friends of the deceased, and for the people handling dead bodies. We pray too for those who are sick with malaria and other illnesses who are seeking health care that is limited at this time, and for knowledge and truth to be revealed to people about Ebola and how it is spread.
