- As a whole, worship attendance is slipping across the country, we're bucking the trend
- The first quarter of 2014 was a harsh winter compared to 2013
- Construction issues with parking, air conditioning, heat, etc. have made attendance a challenge

DEEPER

2014 was a banner year with small group ministry. We had 26 groups meeting during the fall for Christian to the Core. In these groups persons were energized in their Christian growth. Existing and new groups are carrying the momentum into 2015.

TOGETHER

Christian community is being discovered in the jump start of the fellowship team, covenant discipleship groups, small groups, and Sunday morning fellowship. Intentional efforts are being put forth to help people come, be received and be integrated into the life of the congregation.

OUTWARD

We have reached out in loving service with "Stop Hunger Now", new and existing outreach ministries, and all sorts of support locally, nationally and internationally. Through our ministries of small groups and worship, more and more people have been challenged to step out and serve others.

The long and rich heritage of the congregation continues as we find the living and transforming path of discipleship lived out. Thanks for what you're doing and discovering on the path of Christ-centered discipleship.

With the break in weather recently the roofers were able to get enough roof on the new construction that it is dried in and heated. Framers are putting up walls, electrician running

electrical service, and HVAC ductwork is being installed. Framing and finishing of windows in the Education Wing has begun. The completion date continues to be pushed back. Wednesday, February 18th the construction trailer was removed and that center of activity moved into the construction area as a cost savings.

Cost overruns are being monitored carefully. The overall costs have increased significantly, but scaling back some areas have created a new increase that appears to be manageable with our debt limits.

- South & East parking lots (access to the south end of the Education Wing and into iConnect)

- The law offices on the corner of Mentor Avenue
 Murray Avenue (sanctuary access)
- The Village Plaza (east one block on Mentor Ave.)
- Jimmy's Backyard Barbeque (only in the rear please)

Please be respectful of those who face hardship with longer walks. As you are able, please park farther away.

THROUGH THE YEARS

March is Women's History Month (designated by the U.S. Congress) and many, many women have helped shape the Methodist faith. Sarah Crosby, as early as 1761 preached to crowds in England about Christ and the Wesley movement. While not recognized as a preacher because of her gender, Rev. Wesley encouraged her to preach to thousands of the faithful for many years displaying her "extraordinary call".

Barbara Heck is considered the mother of American Methodism. She urged Philip Embury to begin preaching in New York City. She was also behind the construction of the John Street Methodist Church, one of the two earliest Methodist churches in the United States. John Street Methodist still exists in lower Manhattan.

Sojourner Truth, a slave emancipated in New York State when slavery was abolished there in 1827, founded the Kingston Methodist Church.

Perhaps one of the most significant women in Methodist history is Dr. Clara Swain. She was born in Elmira, New York in 1834 and joined the Methodist Church at age eight. This influenced her to pursue a "Christian profession". She graduated from the Women's Medical College of Pennsylvania in 1869 and answered a call for a female doctor to go to India (at that time male doctors were not allowed to treat females). Dr. Swain arrived in India in 1870 and began caring for patients and also witnessing for Christ. She gave clinical experience to females who were working with orphaned sick and eventually thirteen of these women passed their exams to become doctors. In 1874, the Clara Swain Hospital opened as the first hospital for women in India. Dr. Swain worked in India for twenty-seven years, she passed away on Christmas Day, 1910. Her contribution to medicine in India, particularly for women, is immense.

These are but a few examples of the countless women who have served the Lord and helped build our denomination. On May 4, 1956, women achieved full clergy rights in the Methodist Church, a milestone achievement for women.
