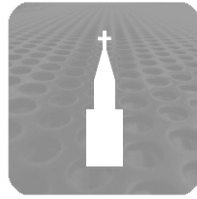

From the Pastor

"Under Wraps"

One of my favorite Advent writers, Ann Voskamp, in her book, "The Greatest Gift – Unwrapping the Full Love Story of Christmas", shares these words:

Big and glossy and loud and fast—that's how this bent-up world turns. But God, when He comes—He shows up in this fetal ball. He who carved the edges of the cosmos curled Himself into a fetal ball in the dark, tethered Himself to the uterine wall of a virgin, and lets His cells divide, light splitting all white. He gave up the heavens that were not even large enough to contain Him and lets Himself be held in a hand. The mystery so large becomes the Baby so small, and infinite God becomes infant. The giver become the Gift, this quiet offering. This heart beating in the chest cavity of a held child, a thrumming heart beating hope, beating change, beating love, beating the singular song you've been waiting for—that the whole dizzy planet's been spinning around waiting for.

She has such a rich and vivid way of sharing the emerging news that becomes Christmas' declaration. Over the four Sundays of Advent, we will be lighting the Advent candles, and then the Christ candle on Christmas Eve. In doing so we marvel at this mystery of Immanuel, God with us.

During the weeks of Advent, and Christmas Eve, we will be peeling back the layers of the Christmas wrap and discover in the Christmas story that God is...

Disruptive
Jealous
Faithful
Joy

Through The Years

The year, 2018, marks the bi-centennial, not only of our church, but of perhaps the most beloved Christmas Carol of all time, Silent Night. The story of how the carol was written and its two writers, Father Joseph Mohr and Franz Gruber, is quite fascinating. The lyrics were written in 1816 as a poem by Father Mohr, a Catholic priest in the town of Oberndorf, Austria. Father Mohr's life story is compelling. He was born in 1792 the illegitimate son of a knitter and a soldier. His father abandoned Joseph and his mother. He grew up with his mother, grandmother and step-sister in very poor conditions. Aid came when he became the godson of the executioner of Salzburg. The choir vicar at the local church noticed Joseph's talent and he received musical training and later attended seminary. This required a papal dispensation because of his out of wedlock birth.

Franz Gruber was born in 1787, the fifth child of Josef and Anna Gruber. Young Franz had a passion for music at an early age, much to the displeasure of his father who wanted him to be a weaver like he was. Franz impressed his school music teacher who gave him free lessons. Later, he took his exams to become a teacher. He also took a job as choirmaster and organist at St. Nicholas Church in Oberndorf, Austria. There he met Father Mohr, the assistant pastor.

Father Mohr wanted a new carol for Christmas Eve mass in 1818. He took the poem he had written in 1816 and walked three kilometers to Franz Gruber's house to see if he could write some music for the words. Gruber composed the music in a few hours and later that night, December 24, 1818, the carol Silent Night was first performed. Since the church's organ was out of commission due to the flooding of the Salzach River, the work was written with guitar accompaniment, which Father Mohr played. The first performance of the carol in the United States was at Trinity Church in New York City in 1839.

Father Joseph Mohr died in 1848 and Franz Gruber passed away in 1863.

The carol has gone on to be translated into more than 140 languages. UNESCO has designated it a World Heritage Song. The original church where Silent Night was first performed was torn down in the early twentieth century due to frequent flooding and moved a half mile upstream. A memorial chapel, the Silent Night Chapel, was constructed at the original site.

This year, the nation of Austria is celebrating the 200th anniversary of the carol with exhibits at nine museums. It is celebrating "Austria's Peace Message to the World."

As we sing Silent Night this Christmas Eve, let us remember the story of a priest and a musician who wanted to have a carol for a Christmas Eve Mass 200 years ago and the lasting effect it has on people all over the world. Peace on Earth, Merry Christmas!

December Prayer Focus - Nancy Landerholm

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one." This phrase, of the Prayer Jesus taught us to pray, will be our focus for December and then again in January. We need to understand that to be tempted is common to all. James 1:14-15 gives us the steps that temptation takes. First, there is a desire. Often the desire is a normal desire that goes out of control (ex: the desire for sex out of control leads to adultery, fornication, pornography, etc.). Next, we start to doubt God's goodness and think that God is holding out on us if we cannot have our desires met, how and when we want them to be met. Now, God's truth is replaced by a lie of Satan.

Satan knows our areas of weakness and knows just the right bait to use to lead us into giving into the temptation. Once we have given into temptation, we have sinned. We suffer the consequences of our sin. This is a battle we all fight and we CANNOT win on our own. We need the help of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. That is why we NEED to pray this daily. 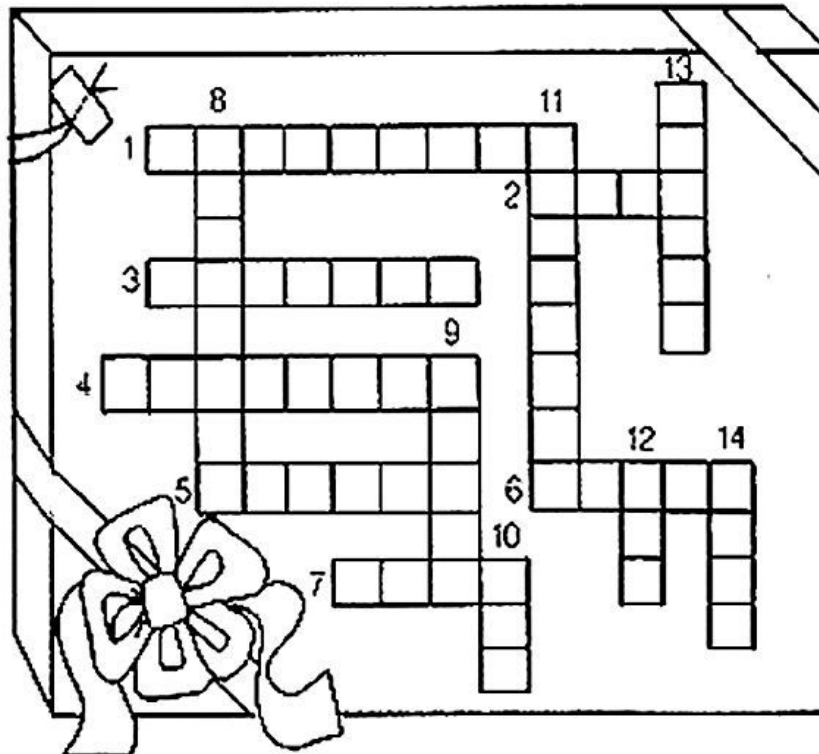
