#### **General Conference**

The United Methodist General Conference, the denomination's highest lawmaking assembly, has been rescheduled for August 29 – Sept. 6, 2022. The global gathering of United Methodists was to occur in May 2020, but due to the pandemic was postponed until August 2021. Due to the ongoing effects of the pandemic, General Conference has been further delayed.

A special one-day General Conference will be held on May 8, 2021 to deal with 12 specific items of legislation.

East Ohio Conference will host an Information Forum about General Conference Saturday, March 13 from 1 – 3 PM to learn about the postponement and the Special Called Session.

The Conference Council on Ministries, members of the East Ohio General Conference delegation, and Bishop Tracy S. Malone will give leadership to this forum, which will provide information about:

- why the 2020 General Conference has been postponed, and
- why the implications of further delaying General Conference warrants the need for a Special Called Session of General Conference.

The information forum will be livestreamed on the East Ohio Conference website: <a href="https://www.eocumc.com">www.eocumc.com</a> There is no registration for this forum, which will consist of presentations of information and a Question & Answer session. Instructions will be given during the livestream explaining how you will be able to ask questions remotely during the forum.

# Dear MUMC Families,

We are excited to kick off our Heifer Project this year with families donating to help end world hunger and poverty. Heifer International is a global organization that works to strengthen local economies by providing food security and nutrition as well as an increase in income and assets to families.

This year we will work toward purchasing a flock of chicks for families in need. For every \$20 donated, Heifer International will provide a family with a starter flock of 10 to 50 chicks, along with the training that will empower them to turn this one-time donation into a lifetime of opportunity. Each flock provides eggs and protein for nourishment, boosts income through sales of extra eggs and offspring, and ensures security for generations to come. Chickens require little space and can thrive on readily available scraps; this allows families to make money from the birds without spending much. And since a good hen can lay up to 200 eggs a year, a flock of chickens provides a steady source of nutrition and income.

Our church goal is to raise enough money to purchase 50 FLOCKS (\$1,000 total) by April 3.
