Dear Shining Stars, We conclude our "ReCapturing Church" series and a look at Paul's letter to the Philippians by reimaging our lives fully in step with Jesus; fully attune; fully developed; fully transformed. "Then you will shine among them (the world or those who aren't in step with Jesus) like stars in the sky ....'

One of the things I miss about country living is a clear, dark sky. Even in my quiet neighborhood there are many street lights and house lights, and even a glow of the city. Traveling beyond the city limits or to the lake for an evening view of a dark sky does not happen very often. Yet I still can experience the effects of a star's twinkle or the moon's glow. Light years away, their shine still makes a difference.

Jesus makes a difference. He is light – and no darkness can overcome him. As Jesus takes up residence in us he shines

through us. Or he wants to shine. The world or those who aren't in step with Jesus have an opportunity to see Jesus ... be impacted by Jesus .... be transformed by Jesus .... by those willing to be open to Jesus' transforming love and power.

The hungry are fed – More than a Meal; food distribution Immigrants are welcomed – food; diapers; encouragement

Children are nurtured – tutors; playground equipment; school supplies

Mentor UMC finds ways to do these things and much more ... because followers of Jesus are committed and engaged, ready and willing to shine for Christ.

May you be open to Jesus' transformation because then you will find ways to shine.

Let's reimagine the difference Jesus' light shining through us can make! That's the church Jesus is calling us to be together ... one shining light joining with others ... until Jesus' light is recognizable in our community.

### Catalyst Ministries School Partnership Program

This September, our Mission focus is Catalyst Ministries, a local organization run by Neal Nelson, whose mission is to connect churches with the needs of the Painesville community. Their main ministries are the Painesville School Partnership Program (SPP) and Woodlawn, both of which are supported by MUMC.

While other agencies (such as Salvation Army) donate school supplies to children in the summer, this is the only donation of school supplies during the school year. These supplies go to the teachers to help their students. (Teachers often use their own money to provide these replacement supplies). MUMC collects these supplies in Sep, Oct, Feb, and March. ## Boundaries Training October 9, 2021, 10 AM to Noon at MUMC (Zoom option available)

Boundaries training is a common practice in the church as a way to give clear definition to what we can and cannot do in our ministry with and to others. We are all caring disciples who have meaningful ministry connections, both internally and externally, through Mentor UMC. Here is a basic way to understand the importance of boundaries in the life of the church:

"Boundaries are the limits or borders we place on relationships that allow us to balance closeness and freedom. Boundaries can exist to safeguard as well as to delineate what is acceptable and unacceptable behavior. When you are ministering to another person, not only do you need to respect their boundaries, you must also set boundaries for your relationship with them. Remember, as a pastor or lay minister, you are considered to be a person with authority and responsibility, which means you need to consider your interactions with others."
