Hymn History: The words to this hymn were written by Leon Adkins. He was born in Ticonderoga, New York in 1896. He graduated from Middlebury College and the Boston University School of Theology. He was an ordained minister in, as it was then called, the Methodist Episcopal Church. He ministered to several churches in upstate New York. Adkins was also a poet as well as a hymn writer. The hymn we sing today was written in 1955. Adkins put his words to the tune Lancashire, written by the nineteenth century composer, Henry Smart. It was first performed at the University Methodist Church in Syracuse, New York in 1955. Adkins also served on the Methodist Hymnal Committee in 1964. He also served on the Board of Education of the Methodist Church which is located in Nashville, Tennessee. He died in Saratoga Springs, New York in 1986
