Pastor's Letter Culture of Call

We, who are many, are one body in Christ,...
We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us.

- Romans 12:5-6

In Paul's letter to the church in Rome as well as in his first letter to the church in Corinth (see 1 Corinthians 12), he refers to the church as "the body of Christ" and all the people are members of the one body. Paul goes out of his way to emphasize that every part of the body, though different, is important for the whole. He wants the church to understand that the talents, abilities, skills, knowledge, wisdom, faith, and experience of one person don't make that member any better than another member because all their abilities are gifts from God by God's grace.

In the United Methodist Church, all the way back to the 1700s and the founder of the Methodist Movement, John Wesley, the church's mission has been carried out by the laity. The word *laity* comes from the Greek word laikós, which means "of the people". Throughout our history, the laity have preached, served as missionaries, taught Sunday School, led adult formation, organized programs, visited the sick and imprisoned, fed the hungry and provided for those who needed clothes, prayed for the hurting and marched for justice, balanced budgets and maintained facilities for worship and ministry, sung in choirs and praised in praise bands, shared the good news of Jesus in the community at home and at work, used visual arts, dance and music to convey the depths of God's love and grace, led youth and children's ministries, and so much more. Without the laity responding to God's call to serve, the church would not look like the Body of Christ.

This Sunday, October 20th, is the first of two Sundays that focus on call. As Christians, we are all called. We see in the Bible and still today, God calls each of us to use our gifts not only at church, but in our day-to-day lives at work and in the community.

I am so grateful to serve at Mentor UMC where the laity answer the call to serve every day. And, get this, a Good News paradox...as you serve, sharing your time, gifts, talents, prayers, and resources, you receive more in return! Serving draws us nearer to God and to one another. There is joy in service.

This Sunday, at 4 PM at Headlands Beach in Mentor, you are invited to renew your baptismal and church membership vows as we welcome new members into the Body of Christ called Mentor UMC.

How have you been blessed through serving? How is God calling you to use your gifts for service in 2025? Praise God who makes us the Body of Christ!
